DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES:

Alternative Medicine and natural therapies are living an unstoppable rise in our days and have become an essential addition to the treatment of many ailments. This course provides a general overview of current alternative medicine practices, mainly in Spain. Needless to say, that they growing number of alternative medicine users all over the world, in the past and in our present days, makes this course essential in the formation of future professionals in the field.

This course of Alternative Medicine aims to encourage and promote the knowledge of Alternative Medicine and Natural Therapies, as well as to meet the training needs of the increasingly professional and committed health sector.

Upon a successful completion of this course students are able to discuss and compare the strengths and weaknesses of alternative medicine and traditional Western medicine, as well as their methods and treatments objectives. Students also apply alternative medicine treatments and principles via practical assignments to different pathologies, and are able to discover the connection between mind and body.

CLASS FORMAT:

In class professor will use different ways to communicate graphic information to students: power points, DVDs, documentaries, articles, readings...Although there will be weekly lectures, this course requires that the student participates in class bringing up questions, formulating doubts, solving puzzling situations, engaging in constructive debates, and thinking aloud about the materials. The strategy followed by the instructor is the cooperative learning process. This is an interactive course in which students learn in large part by contrasting their thoughts with those of their colleagues and with materials provided by the instructor. Visits to different medical/health centers will take place during the course.

ATTENDANCE POLICY:

20% Portfolio research paper (students are required to write a research paper on a specific topic of the Spanish Alternative Medicines)

20% Midterm written exam

20% Final written exam
